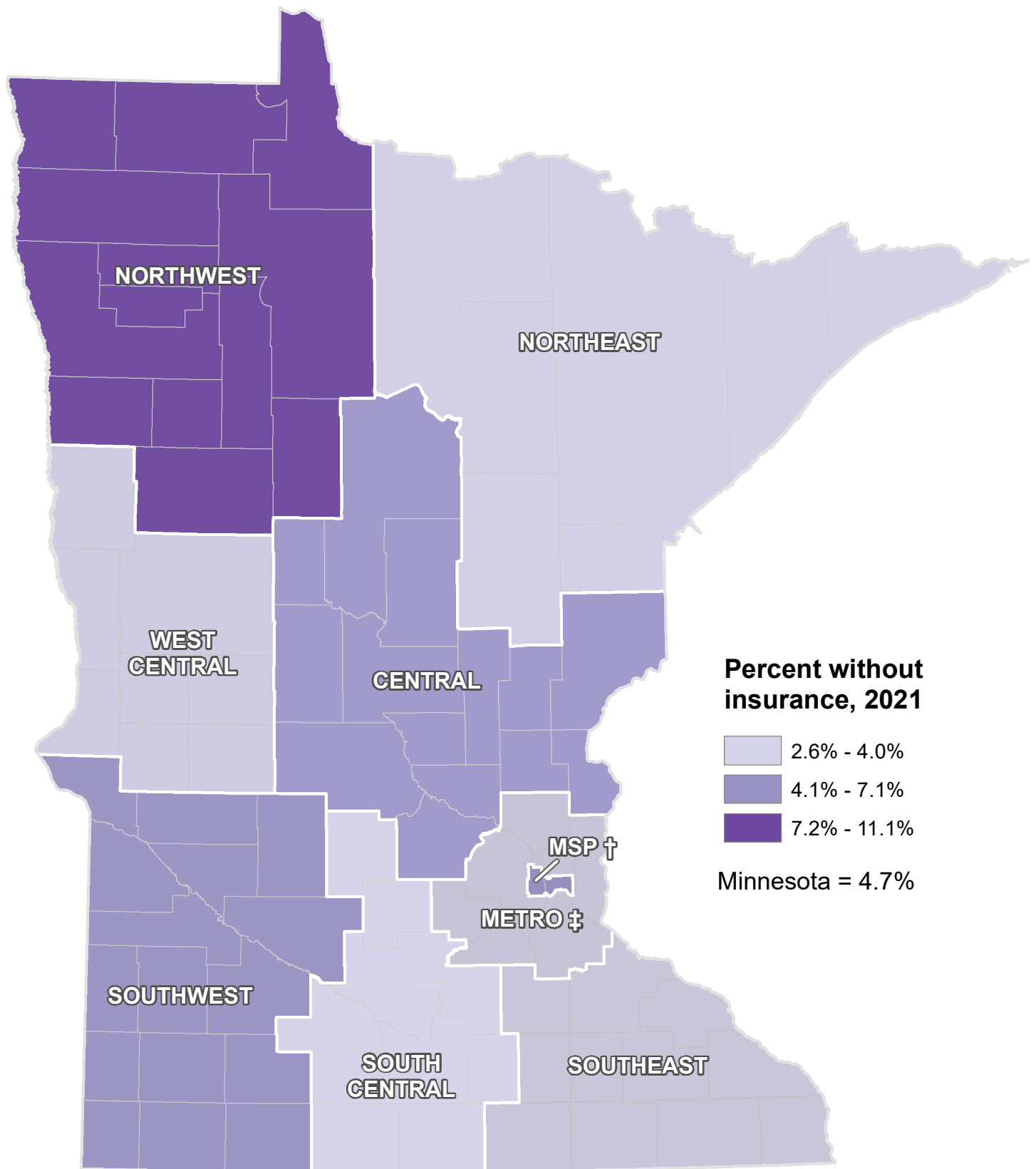
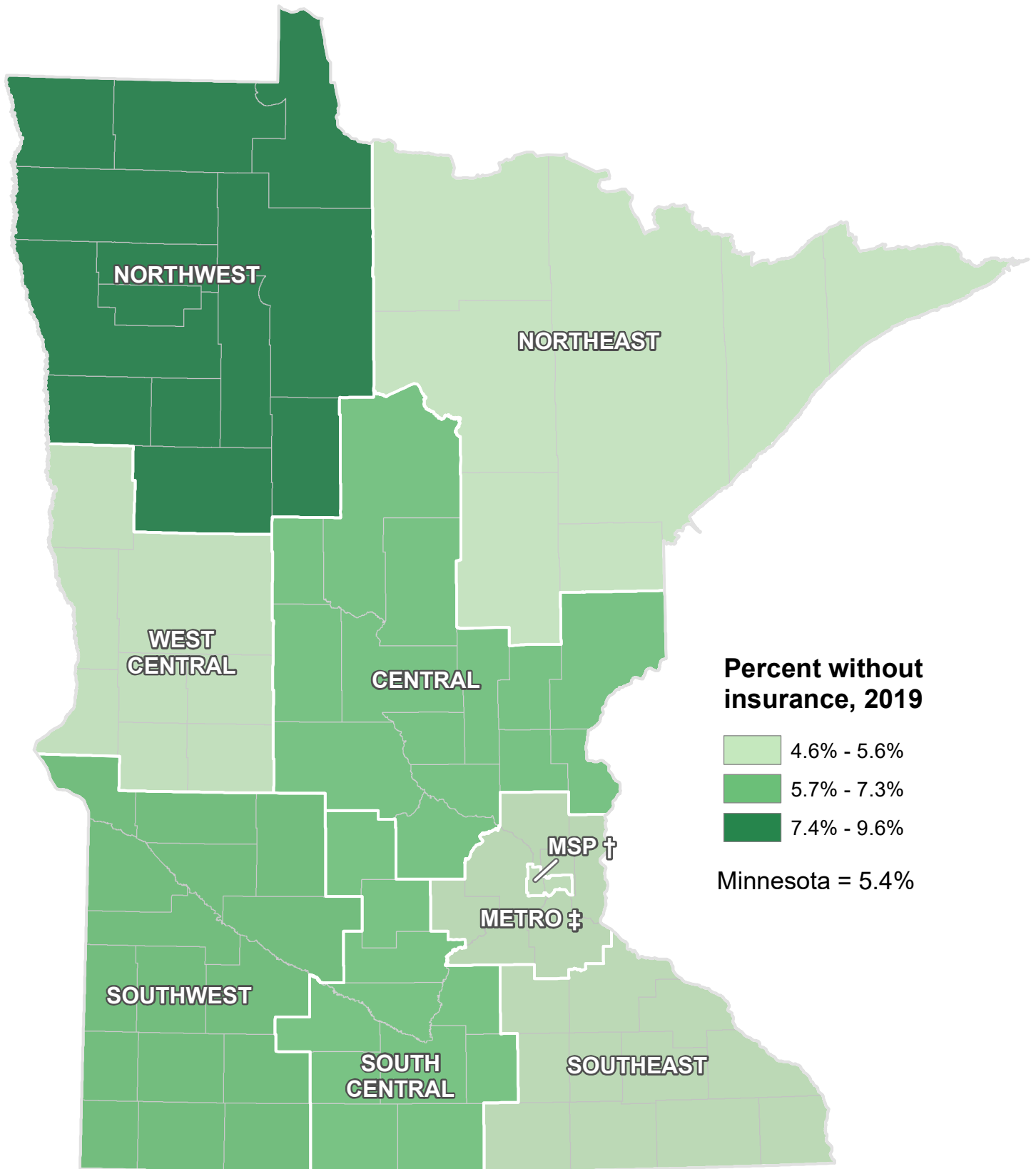


Percent without Health Insurance, 2021



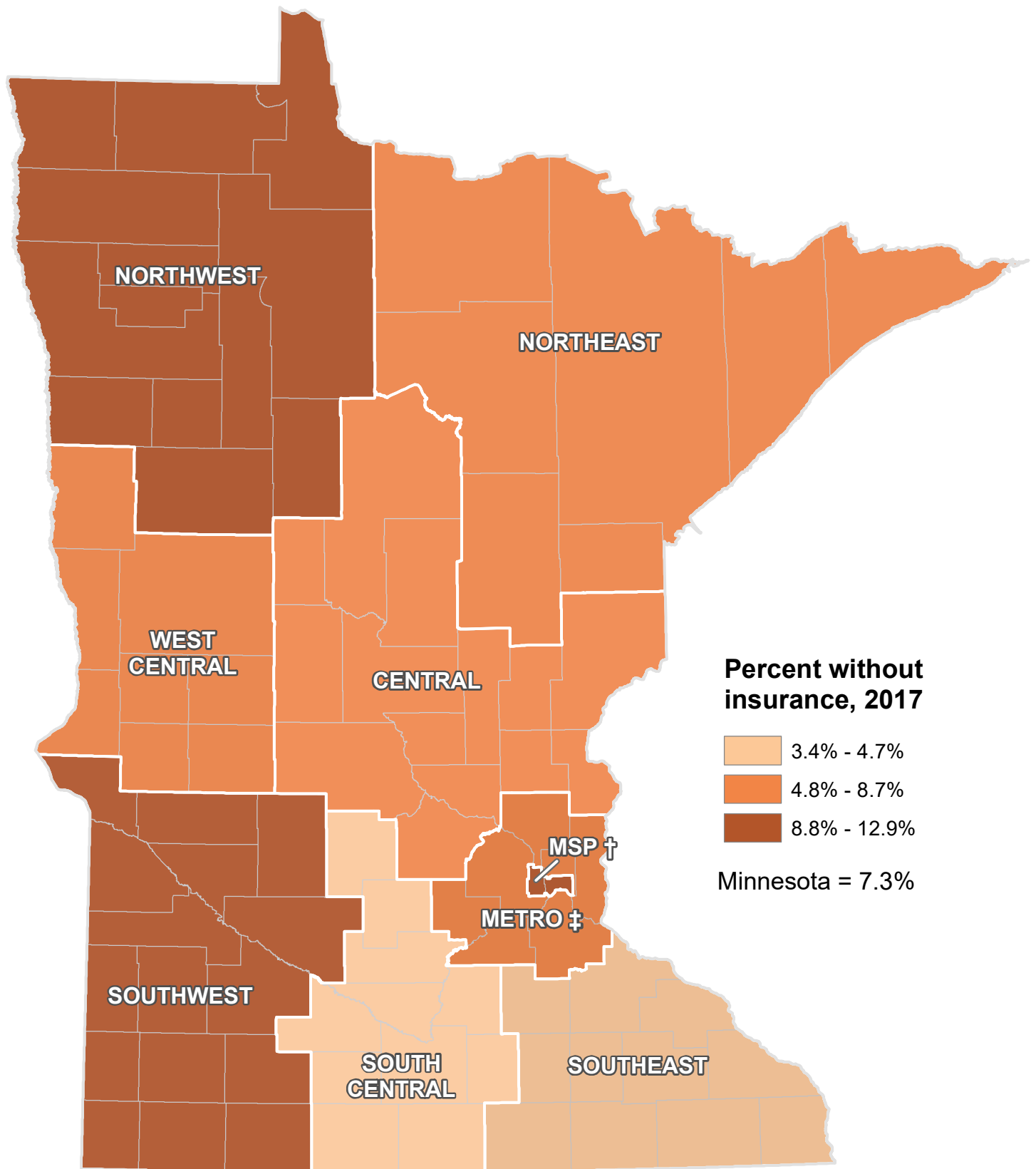

Percent without Health Insurance, 2019



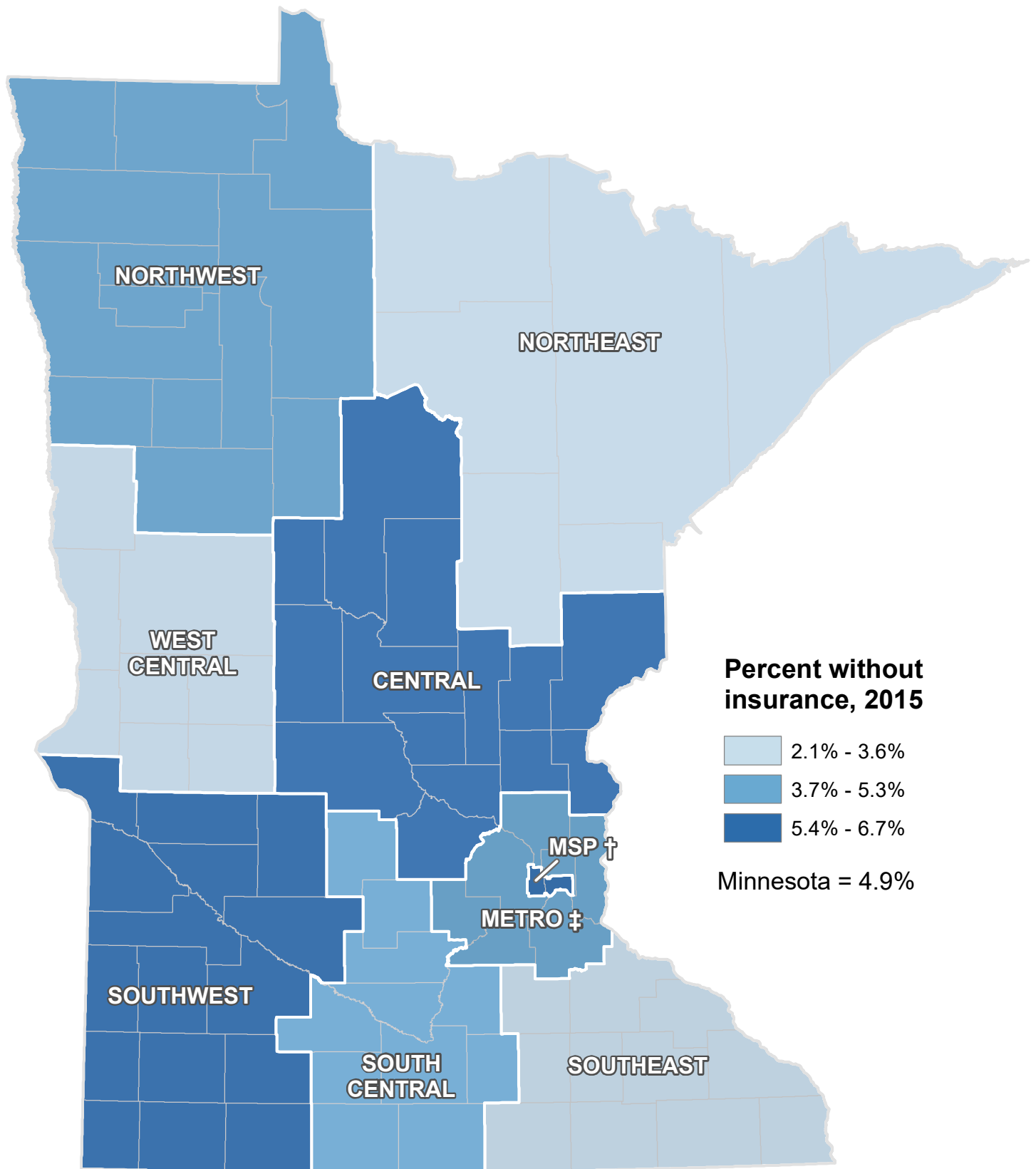

Percent without Health Insurance, 2017



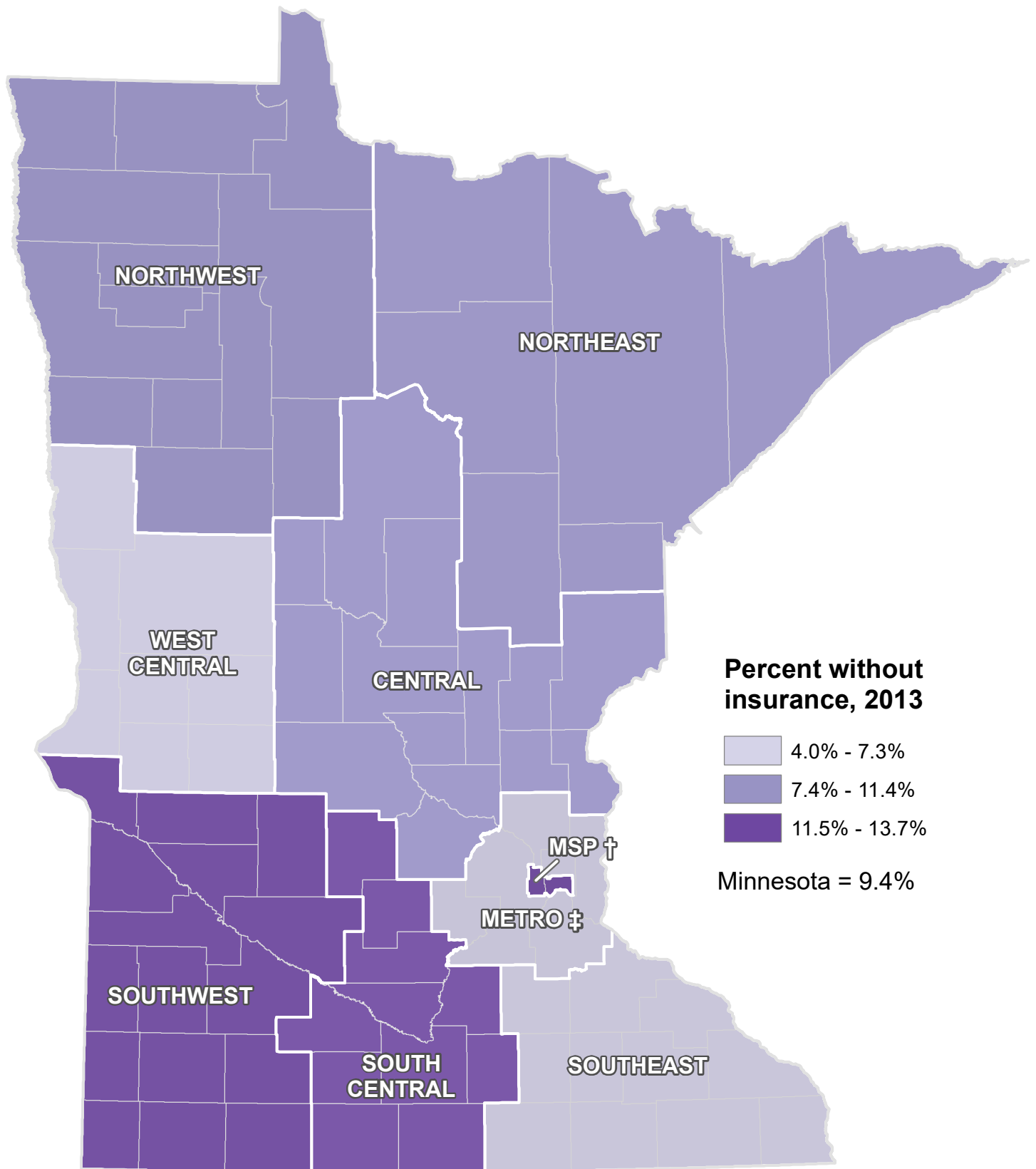
